#### UN Global Digital and Sustainable TF

- Sint efforts of Varied Nations Regional Commissions (SA), ECE, ECIAS, ESS AP, ESCWA) and UNCTAD
- Monitor progress on trade facilitation (TF), including paperless trade and forward-looking measures toward SDGs Enable evidence-based policy-making, capacity building and tech assistance





2012-14: First regional (Asia-Pacific) surveys conducted



2017: 2<sup>nd</sup> global survey; presented at the 6th Global AfT Review with new partners: ADB, Rep. of Korea



2019: 3rd global survey - Digital and Sustainable Trade Facilitation. New partnership with ICC



2023: 5th global survey - UNCTAD became a full partner

2015: 1st global survey on trade facilitation implementation; presented at the 5th Global Review of Aid for Trade in partnership with UNCTAD, ITC, OECD, and subregional orgs.

2018: Launch of interactive website:

2021: 4th global survey, adding additional component on TF measures in time of crisis and epidemic



### Supporting the Digital TF: Framework Agreement on the Facilitation of Cross-Border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific (CPTA)



- A UN Treaty: enabling and action-oriented
  - ✓ Open to interested (53) ESCAP member states (voluntary) to become parties
- **□** Objective
  - ✓ To <u>facilitate</u> cross-border paperless trade (data exchange) among willing ESCAP member states by providing a dedicated intergovernmental framework to develop legal and technical solutions
  - ✓ Complementary to the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) as well as (sub)regional efforts



#### **Survey Scope: WTO TFA+**





60 trade facilitation (TF) measures in 163 countries

**General:** WTO TFA-related measures

Digital TF: paperless trade & crossborder paperless trade

Sustainable TF: for SMEs, Agriculture, and Women

Other TF: trade finance, TF in times of crisis



### Implementation of cross-border paperless trade measures remains low




State of implementation of cross-border paperless trade measures globally








### Implementation of some common measures by CAREC countries (1)





## Framework Agreement on Facilitation of Cross-border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific

- The UN treaty entered into force on 20 February
   2021
- ESCAP is the secretariat of the treaty
- 12 countries have acceded to the treaty.
- More countries will join the treaty soon



#### Implementation of the UN treaty










- Among all tasks, identifying pilot projects and comparing the costs and benefits of conducting cross-border paperless trade for some trade documents are top priorities.
