LEGAL FRAMEWORK



Customs and 77 other regulatory agencies are required to integrate with the PSW platform.



Makes it mandatory for all participating agencies to align their laws, regulations, processes, procedures, and information requirements to the PSW


An Act to make provisions for the establishment of Pakistan single window

GLOBAL RECOGNITION OF PSW

- PSW implementation in 2022 caused Pakistan's score in the UN Survey on Digital and Sustainable Trade Facilitation, 2023 to jump from 56.9% to 70.9%.
- Pakistan showed highest growth in South Asia
- PSW team was invited by the WTO to share its Perspectives in 2023 at its public forum.
- PSW also was invited by WTO to represent
